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Whose Toes is a great app for PreK and K - students match up toes with a person or animal in a game show setting.



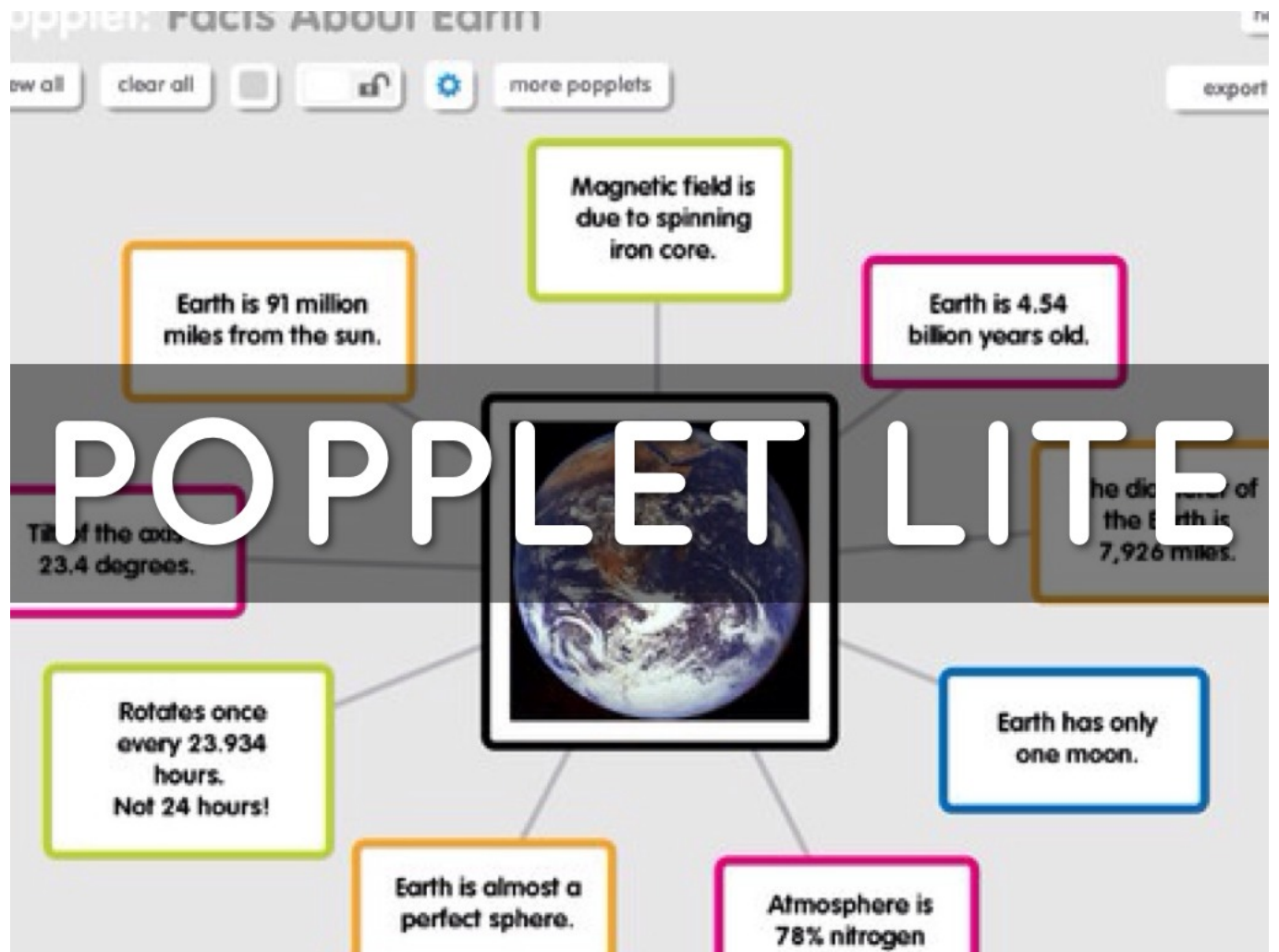
This great PreK-K app is filled with games for early learners. Students can practice animal names, counting, letters and sounds, pattern recognition, colors, matching, and shapes.



This app is alphabet fridge magnets for the iPad! Great for letter recognition and word building.



Sock Puppets is one of my favorite apps! Students can select one or more sock puppets and create a stage for them. They then record themselves speaking for up to 30 seconds, and the app will 'scrub' their voices to make an animated video. Great for retelling stories or explaining content.



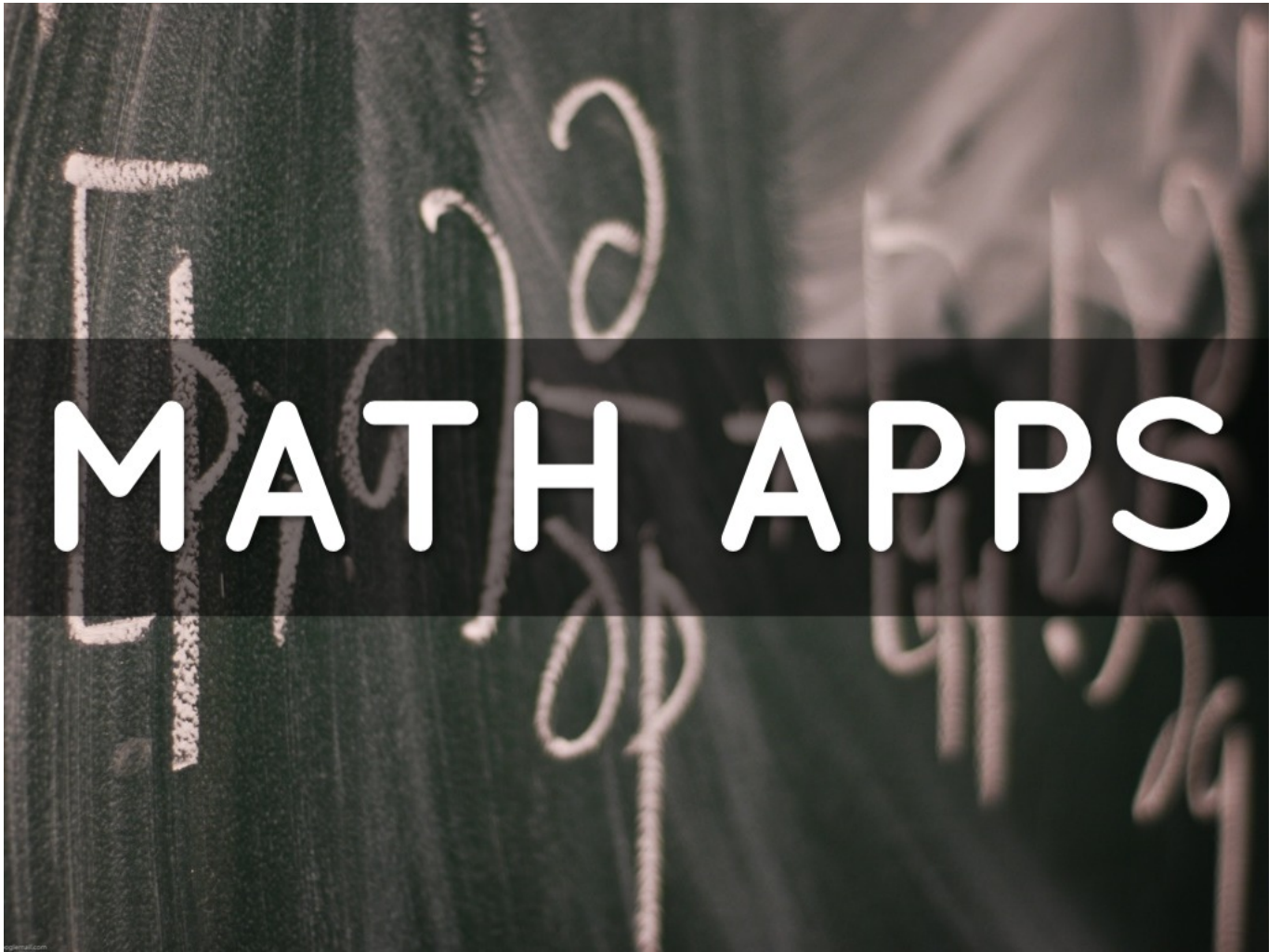
Popplet Lite is a feature filled, easy to use brainstorming app. Easily create beautiful concept maps, and use to help organize research or learning.



Trading Cards is a wonderful app for second to third graders. Students can create their own trading cards about story characters, places, events, and more!



Screen Chomp is a simple to use whiteboard app. Students can use the marker tools to draw and write on the screen. You have the option to record the actions on the screen along with voiceovers. It's perfect for having kids create reteaching videos!





Hungry Fish is a fun math app that reinforces basic addition skills. The first level is number recognition - easy enough for Kindergarten, while the upper levels include larger addition problems. It's bright and colorful, and the kids love earning 'pearls' to let them change their fish's appearance.



Counting Money is probably best for second and third graders. Students need to find the correct amount of coins to match a given amount.



Oh No! Fractions is a fun app for learning about fractions. Students simply swipe to decide if a fraction is greater or less than another.

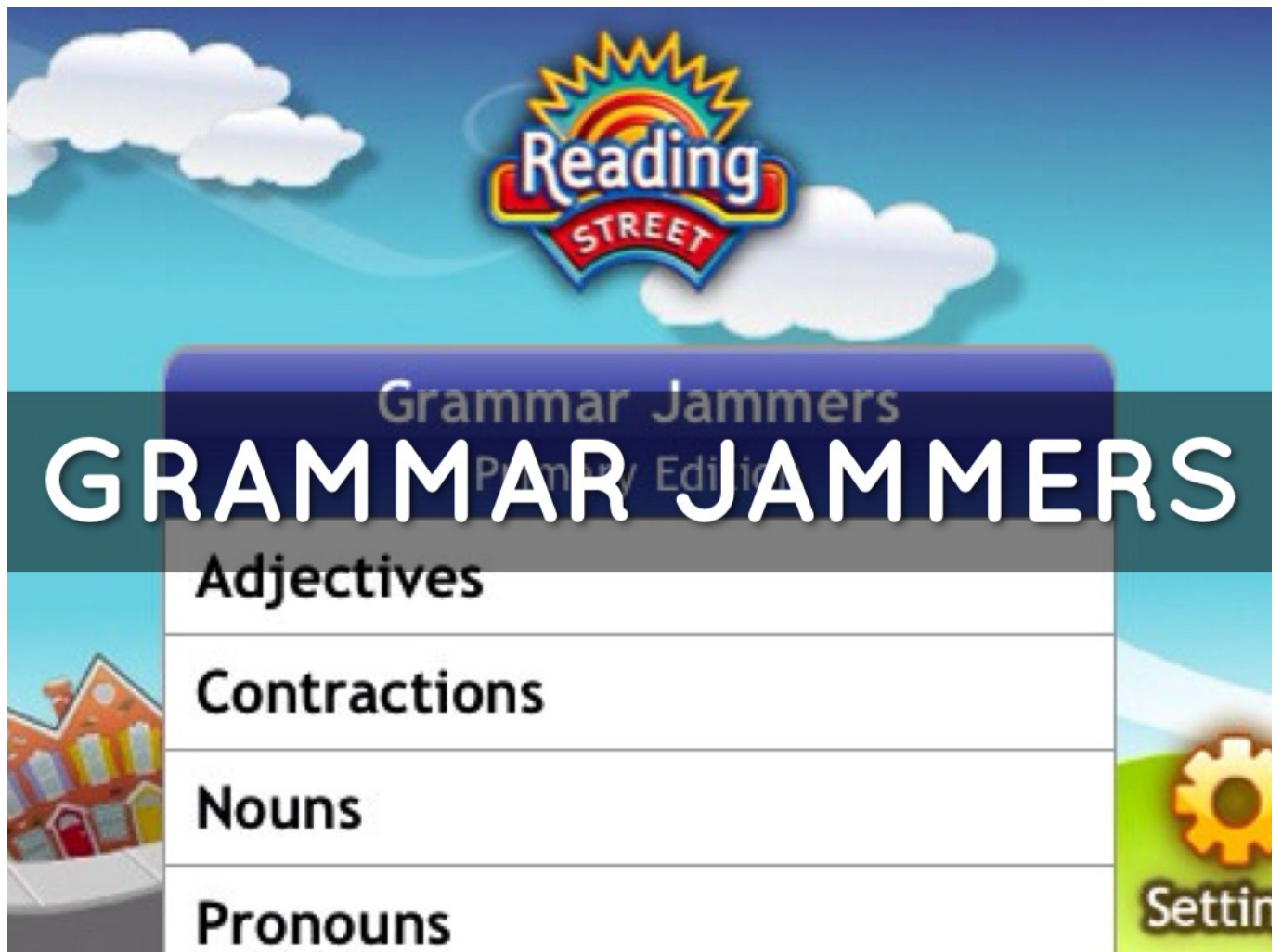


Lobster Diver is a deceptively easy game that gets harder as it goes along. Kindergarten and First students will love the basic number line, while the upper levels add in fractions and negative numbers for older students.





Word Mover is magnetic fridge poetry for the iPad. Choose from a large selection of word banks to create your own poetry or sentences. Create your own word magnets, and customize your backgrounds as well!



Grammar Jammers is a grammar app for elementary students. Short videos with catchy tunes help teach grammar concepts, and the app includes followup quizzes as well.



Sight Word Flashcards helps PreK through Second Grade students practice their sight words. It also includes Question Mode to help assess learning.



Word Float is a fun spelling game where students pop lettered balloons to create words.





Kids love weird facts! National Geographic's Weird But True app is a great way for them to learn all sorts of fun facts.



Stack the States Lite is a fun social studies game where students can learn states and capitals.



BrainPop Jr. - What needs to be said about this app? Log in with the school account to access all of BPjr's great videos. One caveat - it needs internet access to work.



Google Earth is an app with so many possibilities. Learn geography, map skills, and more. Requires internet connection.



StorySmith Medieval Kingdom is a fun story creator for kids. Easy to use for younger kids, but full featured enough for the older ones. A simple drag-and-drop interface lets students create illustrations and write stories with a medieval theme.
